"If you have children at your wedding it's crucial that you keep them entertained and there are several ways you can do this," she tells Your Berks, Bucks & Oxon Wedding. "Creating a kid-friendly corner with arts and crafts is a simple, cheap and effective way to keep the children happy."

If it's a real child-friendly affair, Georgina suggests hiring a professional crèche or

Regardless, if you have a wide age range attending, from your one-yearconsideration could be the key to success. "You and your friends may love the dance music that you've asked your DJ to play, bu what about your older relatives?" reasons Georgina. "Consider mixing up the music played to get them on the dancefloor too and offer them a seating area where they can escape to for a bit of quiet when things get loud."
